

Economic Relations between Lebanon and Syria

The economic and social impact of the Syrian crisis on Lebanon

The Syrian crisis left a severe impact on the Lebanese economy, as a result of the Syrian displacement to Lebanon, and as a result of the closure of the land borders for a period of time with the Arab Gulf states.

Estimates of losses were based on the cost of the widening budget deficit, and on achieving the level of stability in the provision of public services. In addition, the real GDP growth rate decreased by 2.9 percentage points per year, and significant losses in salaries, profits, taxes, individual consumption and investment. The government's ability to collect imports diminished, and government spending increased, which widened the budget deficit.

The number of refugees reached nearly 1.6 million, which is 37 percent of the population in Lebanon. This pushed about 170,000 Lebanese below the poverty line, in addition to a million currently living below this line. This means allocating millions of dollars to advance the national program to support the poorest families. The difficult conditions in the labor market also exacerbated. The influx of refugees increased the supply by between 30 and 50 percent. Unemployment doubled to about 39 percent having the displacement crisis coincide with the worst economic crisis Lebanon is going through.

The presence of the refugees impacted the sectors of health, education and social safety nets. The increase in demand for health services has led to an increase in unpaid dues to hospitals, stress on the health sector, and a sharp increase in cases of infectious diseases. The enrollment of about 200,000 refugees in schools led to an increase in the demand for educational services, and consequently to increasing financial costs, which had a negative impact on the quality of education. Demand on water and electricity also increased, and the level of solid waste management and municipal services decreased. The Syrian crisis posed a serious challenge to the social and sectarian balance in Lebanon. The influx of refugees led to overcrowding, failure to secure basic services, and competition in the labor market.

The development of trade exchange between Lebanon and Syria

The trade exchange between the two countries witnessed a remarkable change due to the security developments that Syria witnessed in the period between 2011-2019. Trade

exchange decreased from 525 million dollars in 2011 to 283 million dollars in 2019, a rate of 46 percent.

The trade balance deficit, valued at \$ 95.3 million in 2011, turned into a surplus of \$ 342.3 million in 2013 due to the increase in oil derivative exports from Lebanon to Syria, and into a surplus of \$ 97.8 million in 2019.



The value of Lebanese exports to Syria decreased in 2019 compared to 2011 by 11 percent, and it had recorded a record value in 2013 of \$ 523.6 million, due to the high value of oil derivative exports, and being it related to the security situation and the economic embargo on Syria. Also, the value of exports of several customs' chapters of goods to Syria increased, and all these increases are also related to either the security situation, or to meeting food needs, or production.

The value of Lebanese imports from Syria decreased in 2019 compared to 2011 by 70.3 percent, and it had recorded a record value in 2010 of \$ 339.4 million. Noting that the increase in the value of the imports of several customs chapters of goods from Syria was related to flooding the Lebanese market with Syrian products due to its low cost and meeting the needs of the Syrian exodus to Lebanon.

Commercial traffic through customs offices

The Lebanese commercial movement through customs offices witnessed major changes in the year 2019 compared to the year 2010, which were reflected by changes in the weights of border crossings in the movement of trade exchange. This is due to the closure of the "Naseeb" land border crossing between Syria and Jordan leading to the Arab Gulf states, as well as the land crossings with Iraq.

In terms of Lebanese imports from Syria, the Masnaa crossing recorded a rate of 38 percent in 2010, and this percentage increased to nearly 66 percent in 2019. In 2010, 34 percent of imports from Syria took place through the Aboudieh crossing, and this

percentage decreased to 7 percent in 2019, while imports from Syria through the Arida crossing increased from 3 to 27 percent.

Lebanon exported 58 percent of exports to Syria through the Masnaa crossing in 2010, and this percentage increased to 64 percent in 2019. And it increased through the Arida crossing from 7 to 21 percent, and Lebanese exports to Syria through Aboudieh decreased from 26 to 10 percent .

The most important Lebanese exports and imports to and from Syria

The most important Lebanese exports to Syria in 2019 were plastic and its products (29%), petroleum products (20%), fruits (7%), electrical appliances (6%), and mechanical devices (6%).

The most important Lebanese imports from Syria in 2019 were fruits (15%), soap and laundry preparations (14%), knitted clothes (10%), vegetables and plants (9%), and shoes (6%).



Products with the largest export potential from Lebanon to Syria, according to International Trade Center statistics

According to the latest statistics available on trade exchange between Lebanon and Syria by the International Trade Center (ITC), it is clear that in 2019 Lebanon exported to the world a value of \$ 3.7 billion, of which \$ 190 million were to Syria, or 5 percent. While Syrian imports from the world reached \$ 5.7 billion, of which \$ 190 million were from Lebanon, or 3.3 percent.

Among the most important Lebanese exports to the world in 2019, Syria imported 69 percent of oil derivatives, 36 percent of plastic exports, 28 percent of exports of sugar and its products, 17 percent of fruits and citrus exports, and 16 percent of dyeing and tanning products.



The products with the largest export potential from Lebanon to Syria are bananas, wheat flour and apples. Lebanon has the highest capacity supply with diesel engine <= 75kVA and sunflower seed oil.
